Dear Friends and Supporters,

Spring 2026

This season marked a significant milestone for Winter4Kids. We welcomed 1,846 young people to the mountain, delivering 11,076 lessons and more than 22,000 hours spent outside. Those numbers matter, but what matters more is what they represent. Young people gaining confidence, trying something new, and beginning to see what they are capable of. That is why Winter4Kids exists.

At Winter4Kids, everything we do is centered on what young people take with them when they leave. Through our outcomes, we see that impact clearly. Participants build resilience as they learn to navigate challenges. They experience inclusion, feeling a true sense of belonging. They are supported by a team that shows up for them, consistently. And over time, they develop a sense of empowerment, recognizing their own ability to grow, improve, and succeed.

Winter4Kids is intentionally built just for youth. It is a space where they can learn, take risks, and grow at their own pace. Through our Progression Park and the way our team supports each participant, we create an environment where progress feels natural and confidence builds over time.

This year also brought meaningful growth. We expanded our reach, welcomed new partners, and introduced more youth to winter sports than ever before. At the same time, we strengthened our operations and remained focused on delivering a consistent, high-quality experience for every participant.

This period of growth also marked a leadership transition for the organization. In November, I assumed the role of Interim Chief Executive Officer, following my tenure as Director of Programming and Operations. Having been with the organization since its inception, I am deeply committed to its mission and honored to take on this leadership responsibility. What makes Winter4Kids exceptional has long been evident to me, and it is a privilege to help guide the organization into its next chapter.

None of this work happens without the people who stand behind it. Our staff, partners, and donors make this possible, and we are grateful for the trust you place in us.

There is more ahead. I am excited about where we are going and the work we will continue to do to ensure that every young person who comes to Winter4Kids leaves stronger than when they arrived. Thank you for being part of this.

R.I.S.E. Framework

At the core of our model is the RISE framework—**Resilience, Inclusion, Support, and Empowerment**—which intentionally cultivates what we define as “mountain agency”: a participant’s ability to navigate challenges, make decisions, and persist in the face of uncertainty. Over time, this mountain-based learning translates into “real-life agency,” equipping youth with the mindset and skills needed to succeed in school and beyond.

Our program does more than teach winter sports—it develops resilient, confident, and capable young people who are prepared to navigate challenges, build meaningful relationships, and pursue expanded opportunities in all areas of their lives.

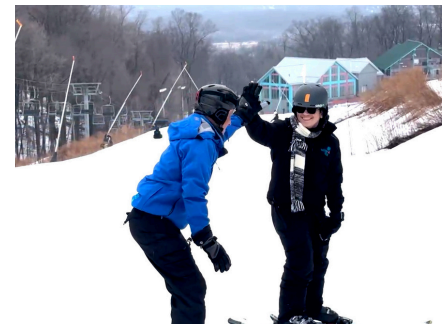

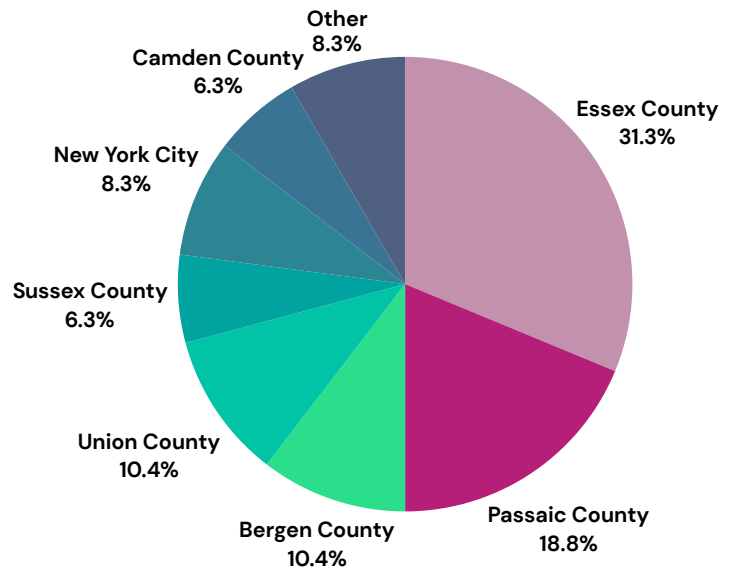

Partners

Winter4Kids partners with 50 organizations across the region to expand access to winter sports and year-round enrichment for youth who might not otherwise have these opportunities. These partnerships are central to our reach, connecting students to transformative experiences both on and off the mountain.

Feedback from participating schools and partner organizations highlights the powerful impact of the Winter4Kids program on the students they serve. Survey responses consistently emphasized increased confidence, belonging, and access to opportunities students might not otherwise experience. The results reflect strong satisfaction with the program and meaningful growth observed in participating youth.

- 96% of participating schools plan to return in 2027.
- 100% of partners said the program provided opportunities students would not otherwise have.
- 100% reported increased student confidence, perseverance, and independence.
- 100% said students felt welcomed and included.
- 77% saw improved student attendance during the program.
